1963 – 1967	scientific co-worker at the College of Teacher Education in West Berlin
1967 – 1970	director of the school pedagogy division at the Pedagogical Center (PZ) Berlin
1970 – 1976	Professor of Primary Education at the College of Teacher Education in West Berlin
1976 – 1993	Professor of Education (school pedagogy and General Didactics) at the Department of Education of the University of Hamburg
1983-1986	member of the Hamburg City Council (parliament of the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg) and SPD's spokesperson for education
1986	marriage to Gerda Luscher-Schulz
1989 – 1993	Chairman of the Department of Education of the University of Hamburg
1991	grant of an honorary doctorate of the College of Teacher Education of Dresden
17.06.1993	death in Hamburg
